

Producers and Consumers

Grade 2 • SOCIAL-STUDIES • Students distinguish between producers who make or provide goods and services and consumers who buy or use them. • Standards: D2.Eco.4.K-2

Read each sentence carefully. Decide if the person is acting as a producer or a consumer. Write your answer on the line.

1. A farmer grows apples on her farm. Is she a producer or a consumer?
2. A boy buys a toy truck at the store. Is he a producer or a consumer?
3. A baker makes fresh bread every morning. Is she a producer or a consumer?
4. A girl eats lunch at a restaurant. Is she a producer or a consumer?
5. A teacher gives lessons to students at school. Is the teacher a producer or a consumer?
6. A man gets his hair cut at the barber shop. Is he a producer or a consumer?
7. A woman builds wooden chairs in her workshop. Is she a producer or a consumer?
8. A family goes to the zoo and pays to see the animals. Are they producers or consumers?
9. A doctor helps sick people feel better at the hospital. Is the doctor a producer or a consumer?
10. A boy borrows books from the library to read at home. Is he a producer or a consumer?

Answer Key — Producers and Consumers

For the teacher / parent. Do not distribute with the worksheet.

1. producer (*The farmer is making goods (apples) to sell to others.*)
2. consumer (*The boy is buying and using a good.*)
3. producer (*The baker is making goods (bread) for others to buy.*)
4. consumer (*The girl is using a service provided by the restaurant.*)
5. producer (*The teacher is providing a service (education) to students.*)
6. consumer (*The man is using a service provided by the barber.*)
7. producer (*The woman is making goods (chairs) to sell.*)
8. consumers (*The family is paying for and using a service.*)
9. producer (*The doctor is providing a service (medical care) to patients.*)
10. consumer (*The boy is using a service provided by the library.*)
